STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Risk management

The trustees have a duty to identify and review the risks to which the charity is exposed and to ensure appropriate controls are in place to provide reasonable assurance against fraud and error.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and activities

The charity was founded with the sole objective of raising funds for patient centric research into inflammatory bowel disease ("IBD") in the UK. The minimum fundraising target is £50,000 per annum. All fundraising is through private donations. As a volunteer run and supported charity, all the funds raised are committed without any deduction to IBD research work.

The charity is currently committed to funding a project led by Dr Charlie Lees of the Gastroenterology Department of the Western General Hospital in Edinburgh. The project is known as PrediCCt and is a patient centric project focusing on the environmental triggers for IBD. Of the initial required financial input of £500,000, the charity has committed the sum of £125,000. Another £125,000 has been committed by an English Charity, namely Crohn's and Colitis in Childhood. The remaining £250,000 is coming by way of grant funding from the Chief Scientist's Office of NHS Scotland.

The Trustees of the charity are actively looking for other projects to support which fit the charity's model of funding patient centric IBD research.

The Trustees are also continually looking to broaden the scope of the charity's donor base and will, where appropriate, continue to work with other likeminded charities and bodies in order to meet the charity's objectives.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

Reserves are held only until suitable research projects can be identified and the Trustees are satisfied that the identified research projects can be funded fully by the charity and its supporters and collaborators.

The Trustees are satisfied that sufficient funds have been kept in reserve to meet the charity's commitment to the above mentioned project.

The Trustees are of the opinion that the funds held in reserve which are not already committed will be largely applied in the coming year as new projects are identified.

**Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of


Independent examiner's statement

The charitable company is entitled to exemption from audit under Section 477 of the Companies Act 2006 for the year ended 30 April 2015.


The members have not required the charitable company to obtain an audit of its financial statements for the year ended 30 April 2015 in accordance with Section 476 of the Companies Act 2006.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
